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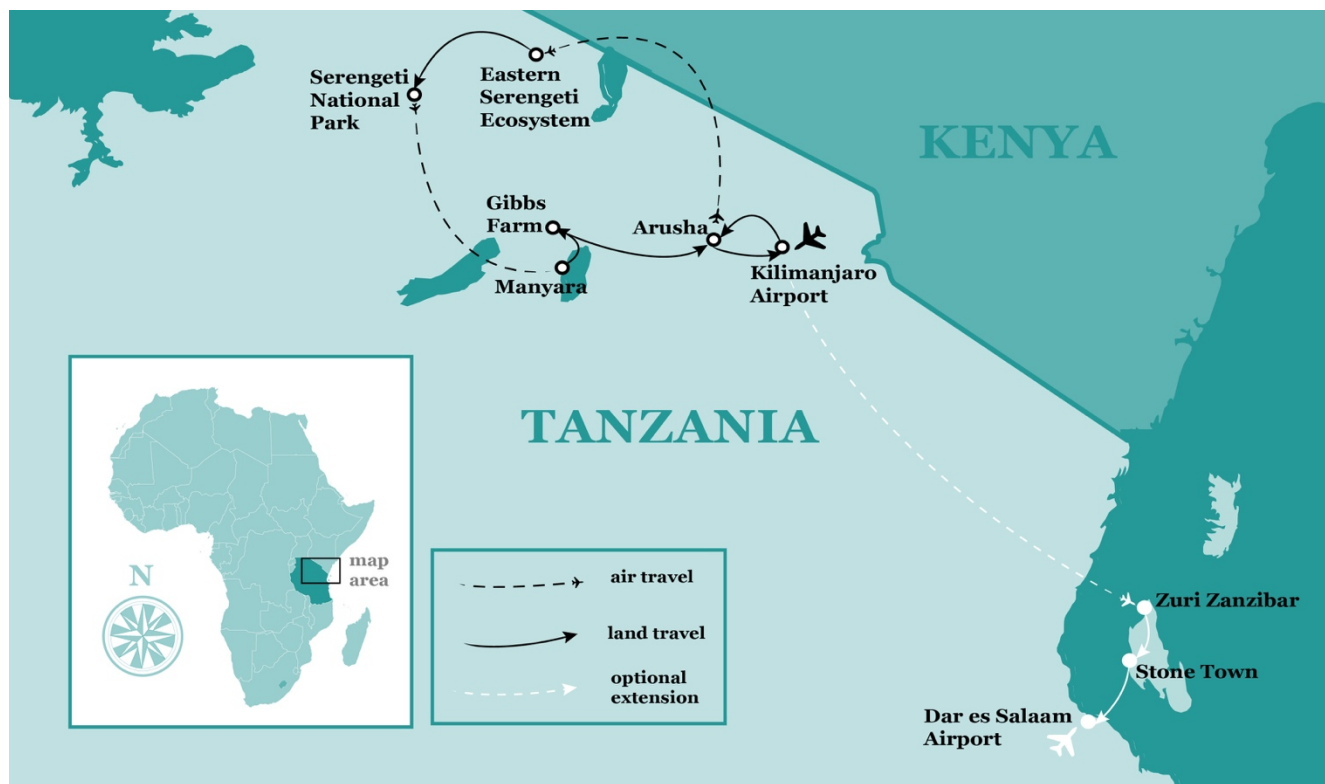
I. OUR SOIRÉE ZANZIBAR EXTENSION

Zanzibar. Its name alone inspires romantic visions of mythical seafaring tales and indigo ocean vistas. Spend the day taking in the local Swahili culture and enjoying the beach – whether swimming, snorkelling, diving, or simply relaxing at the resort. The reefs and coral offer exquisite views, including an immense diversity of vibrant aquatic life: butterfly fish, emperor angel fish, dolphins, lion fish, green turtles, and manta ray are a few of these amazing creatures. Along the beach, you might also see Zanzibari fishermen and sea merchants carving or readying their dhows: these are old Arab-African sailing vessels that have been used to navigate between East Africa and the Arabian Peninsula for centuries. Once a hub for the vast Indian Ocean trading network, Zanzibar became a home for Africans, Arabs, Persians, and Indians alike. The island was the main slave market of the East African Coast and an important center for ivory trade, as well as a home to many clove and spice plantations. Today, fishing and trade by sea remain the backbone of Zanzibar's economy, along with tourism.

Zanzibaris have strong identities that are distinct from their compatriots on mainland Tanzania. They have a resilient culture, having broken away from slavery's shackles and risen above the rule of many different empires and kingdoms. The elements of Persian, Arabic, Indian and European culture are most visible in the culture and architecture of the capital, Stone Town, which was recently declared a World Heritage site by UNESCO.

The cosmopolitan influences continue until today: taarab traditional music mixes with hip hop and R&B; Stone Town's elaborately carved historic doors are matched by a thriving modern artistic community; both Muslim

celebrations and international music and arts festivals are at the pulse of this dynamic island. 97% of Zanzibar's population is Muslim, while the rest is divided between Hindu and Christianity.

III. ITINERARY

Day 1 – Saturday, March 7th - Arusha to Zanzibar

After breakfast at Gibb's farm with our group, we will bid them adieu and head to the airport via private transfer for a 12:30pm Air Excel Flight from Arusha to Zanzibar. We will snack on a boxed lunch en-route during our short trip to this exotic island. Once we land on Zanzibar, Zuri's hotel team will meet us at the airport to for private transfer to this fabulous resort. Spend the afternoon relaxing in paradise.

Each evening, we will meet up at the bar before dinner for a drink and casual talk by our academic host Adam Tooze who will paint the historical backdrop of this island—from the Age of Exploration when the Portuguese Empire was the first European power to gain control of Zanzibar to the country falling into the hands of the Sultanate of Oman, to the Arab slave trade, to the British Empire, to the Zanzibar Revolution all the way to today. Adam's talks will inform our understanding of the culture and architecture all around us.

We will tuck into dinner as a group after our first beachside history lesson. Once at Zuri, all meals will be served at the hotel and included in the trip. You'll have no reason to want to venture elsewhere: the ingredients from the local garden make each dish a delicacy.

Day 4 – Tuesday, March 10th – Stone Town; Dar es Salaam; Home

Say goodbye to the beaches and spend the day in historic Stone Town with its striking architecture before heading back to mainland Tanzania; from where you will eventually catch your departing flight home.

On a private guided tour of Stone Town, you will visit the House of Wonders, a palace built in the 1880's that has since housed the headquarters of the colonial administration, a school and finally, a museum. We will also learn more about the island's tainted history as a slave and ivory trading capital.

Lunch is on your own in Stone Town along with one last stroll. Our guide will direct us to some lovely rooftop restaurants in town.

Finally, we will travel together to the airport and catch a 3:00pm Coastal Air flight from Zanzibar to Dar es Salaam. Our local hospitality team will meet us at the airport for private transfer to the Hyatt Regency's "Kilimanjaro Hotel", where we will have the chance to rest up before our flights back to the United States. Closer to your departure time, you will be picked up for private transfer to Dar es Salaam airport. Please note there is no early check-in available at this airport, so spend the day unwinding at the hotel until the very last minute. We recommend a meal at one of the great restaurants at The Kilimanjaro—enjoying dinner in the garden or a drink on the rooftop with a view!
